

General Info: If you attend a theater show or concert, always show up early (say about 30 minutes). For two reasons. First= Sometimes there are pre-show antics that will go on to entertain people to get them warmed up for the show. Second= at about 5-10 minutes before show time, ask the usher if you can move up to empty seats in the front. Many, Many times they will let you do it. Sometimes they even ask the audience before you get a chance to ask.

If you visit the M&M'S WORLD, be aware that on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor there is a small theater that will show a M&M's movie in 3D that is nice. M&M'S WORLD is located in the Showcase Mall at 3785 S Las Vegas Blvd, next to the MGM Hotel & Casino.



The fountains show at the Bellagio hotel (3600 S. Las Vegas Blvd.) are fabulous at night. The fountains will dance to music. Monday - Friday, 3 p.m. - midnight. Saturday and Sunday, noon - midnight. The fountains run every half-hour until 8 p.m. and every 15 minutes after that until midnight. Fountains are occasionally closed during high winds.



Lion Habitat at the MGM Grand Hotel (3799 S. Las Vegas Blvd.), Open daily, 11 a.m - 10 p.m.. Visitors are separated from the lions by only one and a half inches of glass,



Statue Fountain shows (statues come to life) at Caesars Forum Shops, Every hour on the hour Sunday - Thursday, 10 a.m. - 11 p.m.; Friday and Saturday, 10 a.m. – midnight. Caesar's Palace Hotel, 3570 S. Las Vegas Blvd.



Circus Acts at Circus-Circus Hotel, Sunday - Thursday, 11 a.m. - 11 p.m. Friday and Saturday, 11 a.m. - midnight. Shows are every half-hour.



The Volcano Eruptions at the Mirage Hotel, Beginning at 8 p.m., the volcano erupts every hour on the hour until midnight. 3400 S. Las Vegas Blvd.



White Tigers Habitat at the Mirage Hotel (3400 S. Las Vegas Blvd). Open daily, 9 a.m. - 2:30 a.m. Some of the same tigers used for Siegfried & Roy's magic show.



The Pirate show, now called the "Sirens of TI", at Treasure Island Hotel (3300 S. Las Vegas Blvd). 7:00pm, 8:30pm, 10:00pm and 11:30 p.m. daily. .,



The Gondola boats at Venetian Hotel (3355 S. Las Vegas Blvd.) Sunday - Thursday, 10 a.m. - 11 p.m. Friday and Saturday, 10 a.m. - 11:45 p.m. Free to view, but if you want to ride one, then the cost is \$15 for adults, \$7.50 for children 12 and younger.



Masquerade Village, also known as the “Circus In The Sky” at the Rio Casino Hotel (3700 West Flamingo Rd). Free to view or \$9.95 to get into costume and ride in the show. Tickets are available for all shows. There are 21 total spots available on three different floats. Arrive ½ before show time to get one of the spots. The floats will cruise the casino from the “Ceiling”!!! The Rio is located two large blocks off the strip but not recommended to walk - will need to take a cab from Caesar’s hotel lobby to the Rio as you will need to cross over a highway. ALSO, The food buffet at the RIO casino hotel is one of the best we found. It is also one of the largest. Prices may seem high for the buffet, but you will get a huge selection of foods from around the world!



Bellagio Conservatory, Bellagio Hotel (3600 S. Las Vegas Blvd.), Elaborate floral arrangements beneath a 55-foot-tall glass ceiling. I heard is awesome to view. The flowers are from around the world and they have numerous garden arrangements.



Fremont Street, downtown Old Las Vegas (will require a cab ride – ask for cost to get there and back). Hours of operation: 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 p.m. and midnight nightly. This is where they “covered” all of main street in downtown with an electronic display of LED screen.
